Logistics

Located in the center of the United States, Plainview is easily accessible from the East and West Coasts with Interstate 27 connecting to Interstate 40 within an hour's drive. Plainview and Hale County are well connected by highway, air and rail systems.

Highways Serving the Area - Interstate 27, U.S. Hwy 70, TX Hwy 194 divided 4-lane Highway, FM Hwy 400

Plainview Airport - Runway lengths of 6,000' and 4,000', paved with lights and instruments. Charter and private facilities at Airport and Jet Fuel available. Commercial air service on major carriers within 30 minutes.

Rail - Burlington Northern-Santa Fe with 8 trains daily, including a 100-acre+wind-turbine distribution center.

Ports-to-Plains Trade Corridor

This planned four-lane divided highway will facilitate the efficient transportation of goods and people from Mexico through West Texas to Canada. The Plainview Economic Development Corp. is committed to work with this initiative to enable the trading capacity from Mexico to Canada, and to grow and bring more trade related businesses to the Plainview region.
